Topic

At this time of year, lots of things are beginning to grow and change all around us. We have already been on a bug hunt and have seen lots of bugs and insects such as slugs, ladybirds, ants and woodlice. Go for a walk in your garden or around the park, and see what insects you can find yourself. Can you find any bugs? What did you see? You could take photos of them or draw what you see. What colours can you see on the bugs?

Create 'n Make

What is your favourite bug or insect? What do you know about them? Can you make, paint or draw an insect or bug. You might want to look for it outside, or look for a picture on the internet or in a book. What colour is your insect? How many legs does it have? Did you find any interesting facts about your bug? To make your bug, you could use junk modelling materials or Papier Mache.



Let's talk...

We have recently been talking about our feelings, and have used towers of green and red blocks to show how we are feeling. If we have green blocks we are feeling happy but red blocks make us feel sad. What kind of things can you do or say to give somebody a green block. What could you do to knock somebody's red blocks down if they are feeling sad? Why is it important to be kind?

Physical Development

We've been practising counting to 10 in the Nursery and counting different objects. We've also been practising our jumping and hopping skills. Ask somebody to choose a number between 1-10, or you could roll a dice, now try to jump or hop this amount. For example if you pick 5, you must do 5 jumps. Try to count as you jump. You could also try counting claps, or you could count the number of steps it takes to climb your stairs. Ask a friend or family member to jump, hop or clap and see if you can count how many they do.
