<p>This week, we are looking at words with hyphens</p> <p>co-ordinate re-enter co-operate co-own empty-handed ear-piercing</p> <p>Task – to practise these spellings, make flash cards. On one side, write the first part of the word, on the other, write the second part.</p> <p>Ex. co l own</p>	<p>This week, we are looking again at words which end with –cious or –tious (+ 2 key words)</p> <p>Rule - If the root word ends with –ce, then the ending is usually spelt –cious e.g. grace → gracious.</p> <p>Malicious Fictitious Conscious Infectious Suspicious Gracious Ancient Variety</p> <p>Tasks – Look up the meaning of each word. Can you make your own crossword for them? Don't forget the clues!</p>	<p>This week, we are looking at words that end in –f when singular and change to –ves when plural.</p> <p>half/halves leaf/leaves scarf/scarves shelf/shelves wolf/wolves loaf/loaves</p> <p>Task Write a simple sentence for each set of words. E.g. I bought a loaf of bread. I bought two loaves of bread.</p>	<p>Words with hyphens – sometimes a hyphen is used to join a prefix to a word.</p> <p>co-operate co-ordinate re-examine re-evaluate re-invent re-educate pre-recorded pre-existing</p> <p>Task: Make sure you know what each of the words mean.
