<p>Words ending in 'ance' and 'ence'</p> <p><b>observance</b> <b>hesitance</b> <b>tolerance</b> <b>assistance</b> <b>innocence</b> <b>confidence</b> <b>independence</b></p> <p><b>Task</b> Make cards with the word printed clearly in big letters. Then, cut out a small piece of paper to make a flap that covers the 'ance' or 'ence' in each word. Practise guessing what is underneath and checking if you are correct.</p> <p>c o n f i d </p> <p>c o n f i d e n c e</p>	<p>This week, we are looking again at words which end with <b>-cial</b> or <b>-tial</b> (+ 2 key words)</p> <p>Rule: -cial is common after a vowel letter and -tial after a consonant letter, but there are exceptions</p> <p><b>Social</b> <b>Crucial</b> <b>Beneficial</b> <b>Potential</b> <b>Torrential</b> <b>Substantial</b> <b>According</b> <b>Develop</b></p> <p><b>Tasks</b> – Look up the meaning of each word. Choose five of the words and use them in a paragraph.</p>	<p>This week, we are recapping on some of the trickier words we have looked at so far this year.</p> <p><b>frighten</b> <b>through</b> <b>although</b> <b>school</b> <b>know</b> <b>address</b> <b>difference</b> <b>audience</b></p> <p><b>Task</b> Write out the spelling words and highlight the part of the word that makes it tricky to spell. Then write out the words in interesting ways, e.g. bubble writing or in rainbow colours.</p>	<p>This week we are looking at homophones where the nouns end in <b>-ce</b> and verbs end in <b>-se</b>.</p> <p><b>advice</b> <b>advise</b> <b>device</b> <b>devise</b> <b>licence</b> <b>license</b> <b>practice</b> <b>practise</b></p> <p><b>Task:</b> check you know what each of these words mean. Write an example sentence with each: remember that words ending <b>-ce</b> are nouns; words ending <b>-se</b> are verbs.</p>
