This page aims to give information about the subject areas that your child will be covering in their classes and in their English and Maths sets.

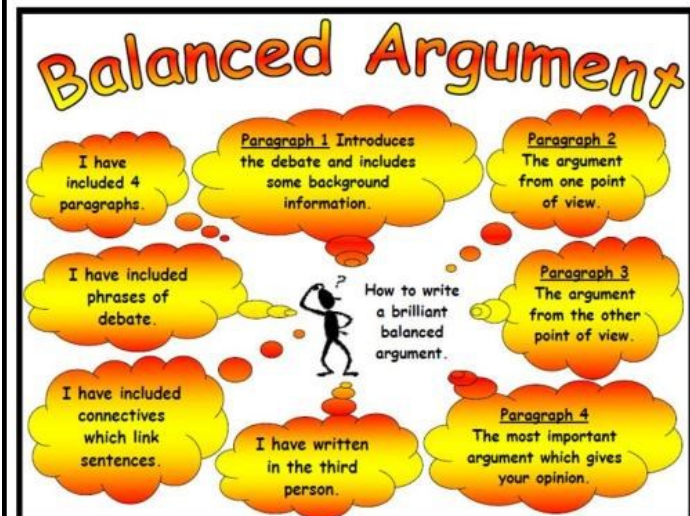
This information is for the week commencing: **Tuesday 8th May.**

English

This week, we will continue with our unit on: **Stories with Fantasy Settings.** We will use the story '*Mouse, Bird, Snake, Wolf*' by David Almond as our stimulus.

The children will complete their balanced argument, before editing and improving their written work.

Spellings will be sent home on Thursday.



Maths

Ms Davies' set: This week, we will practise finding fractions of amounts, where the numerator is greater than 1, e.g. $\frac{2}{7}$ of 49.
X Tables: TT rockstars—battle with Mr Skrein's set

Ms Noorani's set: This week, we will finish our work on comparing and ordering unit fractions, and fractions with the same denominator, and then look at equivalent fractions.
X Tables: division facts linked to the x7 table

Ms Webb's set: We will continue our work on fractions. We will find fractions of numbers.
X tables: 9x 8x 7x

Mr Chamberlain's set: This week, we will practise equivalent fractions, looking at different ways to represent them and seeing if we can spot any patterns.
X Tables: Turbo test to 12 x 12

Ms Creamer's set: This week, we will compare fractions with different numerators and then different denominators, and find equivalent fractions.

Topic

This week, the children will continue to learn about **Greek Gods.** All classes will do some display work to brighten up their classrooms for the summer term.

Science

This week, children will continue to think about our new topic, '**Living Things and their Habitats.**' Children will describe how different habitats provide for the basic needs of different kinds of animals and plants, and how they depend on each other.

P4C/RE

This week, we will look at Hinduism in greater depth. The children will learn the story of Svetaketu and will discuss the idea of humility in a P4C-style discussion. Children will be encouraged to think critically and question one another in a safe and positive space.
