

# Year 4 Home Learning

## Topic & Science

**Topic:** The Greek Gods and Goddesses—This half term we will be learning about the ancient Greeks and how they lived.

**Science:** We are learning about 'All Living Things' which will include food chains, habitats and the human body.

## Proper Project

Almost every Greek city had a theatre. The theatres were open air and built in a semi-circular shape with rows of tiered stone seating around it. The shape of the theatres gave everyone in the audience excellent viewing. All the actors were men. They wore large masks that exaggerated facial features and emotions. The mouth hole was large to help amplify the voices. Greek plays were either comedies or tragedies.

Your task is to create a mask for a Greek play for us to display in the classroom. Ask your teacher if you need any materials.

Bring in some music for your class to listen to or you could even cook some traditional food and bring it in to share with your class!




## Science

In a habitat, animals and plants are interdependent (they need each other). The feeding relationships between the producers and consumers can be shown in a food web.

Use the following information to draw a food web for a pear-tree habitat:

aphid (eats pear-tree sap), caterpillar (eats pear-tree leaves), blue tit (eats pears, caterpillars and aphids), ladybird (eats aphids).

- Label producer, consumers, herbivores, carnivores and predators.
- Which animal has no predators in this web?
