Rainbow foam

Whilst I've been at home, I've been enjoying making rainbow foam with my children; it's super easy to make and requires hardly any ingredients, plus, it's lots of fun. See if you can make some rainbow foam with your family. All you need is:

- 2tbsp of washing up liquid or similar soap.
- Half a mug of water
- A squirt of paint or colouring (if you don't have this then you can just make foam.)

Put the soap, water and paint in a mixing bowl, and either with an electric hand mixer, or cake mixer, mix the ingredients together on a high speed. Now, watch what happens. What does it feel like? If you have different coloured paints, try making lots of different colours. We decided to make foam cakes and ice-creams, using different sized bowls and spoons. What will you do with the foam? Maybe your dinosaurs, animals or play people could stomp around in it?
