
Kit and Sam's Animal Adventure


Philip took lots of photos of the elephants splashing water and of the dolphins being fed by the zookeeper. "I wish we could get closer," said Kit.



After they had been around the zoo, Kit and Sam used the magic map to go and visit some wild elephants and dolphins.




They met a baby elephant who was an orphan. They had to feed him lots of **different** food **because** he was too small to get his own.
