

“Ah, thanks!” replied Mrs Tan. Mrs Tan took the lunch box from the coach driver. Then, she handed it to Kit.


“Phew! Thanks. What a relief!” said Kit. Kit was so pleased to have his lunch box back because he was worried he might have to go without any food.



Dress the Knight


Read a word and then click the object to put it on the knight.
