Getting ready for Year 3

We would answer lots of your questions, show you your new classroom, give you a tour of the junior building and do lots of other things!

To the parents,

We hope you are all safe and healthy and continue to settle in as well as possible to this ongoing changed situation. For week 12 remote learning there are new **English** and **maths** activities. Last week's **wider curriculum** document also provided activities for this week and next. There will be a new set of wider curriculum lessons and activities for the three week period starting 22 June.

In **English**, we are starting a new unit of work based around a video story called Lucky Dip. This is always a really popular unit with the children in Year 2.

In **maths**, the topic is position and direction; this involves lots of physical activity and games so the children should really enjoy it. It covers new learning for Year 2, but builds on work they did in Year 1 and is also great for refreshing and applying their understanding of fractions.

Please also continue to practise calculation using TTRockstars and Numbots (the login for these sites is the same so you can use your Numbots login for TTRockstars and vice versa).

As the other Year 2 teachers have emphasised already, please do not feel pressured to do all the lessons if this is not possible/realistic with your own jobs and family dynamics. Pick and choose what suits your family best. We recognise these are difficult times so therefore the health, happiness and mental wellbeing of everyone is of utmost importance. We will therefore continue to provide a 5 lesson structure in English and maths as a suggestion rather than an obligation.
