Wider Curriculum



You can present your findings in a variety of ways, such as PowerPoint, model or poster, but remember to make it interesting for your audience.

Biomes

In Geography this half term, we will be learning about climate and biomes. Your job is to find out about the different biomes across our planet. Research which animals live there, what the weather is like and which countries have this particular biome. Make an information poster to show your findings. Here are some examples of biomes you could research: forest, grassland, freshwater, oceans, deserts, tundra.

Stone circles

Stone circles can be found all across Europe. Many have been dated back to 3000 BCE or even earlier! Do some research to find out about a stone circle and draw a picture or make a model of it. What do you think it's purpose was? Can you find out about the oldest stone circle in the world?
