



Terms of Reference for Child and Community Committee

The Committee shall consist of a minimum of 5 members of the governing body, one of whom shall be the Headteacher. The quorum for meetings of the Committee shall be 3.

The CCC meets every half term.

Members of the committee also make up an exclusions panel as and if necessary

Chair and clerk are appointed at the beginning of the school year.

- To promote the ethos of the school, focusing on the core values of being: creative, caring and resilient,
- To ensure a broad, balanced, creative curriculum;
- To ensure opportunities are created for all children in the school to develop their talents;
- To ensure children in the school are given support according to their needs;
- To appoint link governors to meet with the SEND team to ensure children are given the support they need and report to the CCC and GB;
- To ensure monitoring of children's academic progress;
- To ensure the school fulfils its safeguarding responsibilities, appoint link governors to monitor the effectiveness of the school's safeguarding policy and procedures and report to the full governing body;
- To ensure all aspects of the children's development are nurtured (creative, cultural, intellectual, moral, social, emotional, physical and spiritual);
- To promote diversity, equality and greater inclusiveness within the school;
- To ensure the school's behaviours policy is effective and that children feel safe in school;
- To ensure support from home is encouraged, welcomed and valued
- To ensure children, parents and the school community have equitable opportunity to make a positive contribution;
- To promote good citizenship;
- To promote tolerance and respect;
- To promote healthy life-styles;
- To ensure the wellbeing of children, staff and families is considered and cared for;
- **To report back to the full Governing Body at each meeting.**
