- 1.2.3 Following the extra GB meeting at the beginning of summer term 2 it was agreed to restructure the GB going forward for next academic year to have a more co-ordinated approach with the work of the RC and CC Committee and reduce duplication of work. In additional the GB proposed to set up a Finance working party to closely monitor the budget in separate meetings.
- 1.2.4 As part of the GB evaluation governors will also look at succession planning and recruitment from parents lower down the school. A discussion took place about the possibility of looking at co-chairing.

#### 2. SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT

#### 2.1 SELF EVALUATION WORKSHOP

2.1.1 All governors were invited to participate in a SEF workshop. The HT presented the revised SEF, which was circulated to the GB ahead of the meeting. A full discussion took place reviewing the different sections of the document and the following areas highlighted:

#### **Quality of Education:**

- How is the school looking at impact and recording the impact.
- Clear focus on quality of education
- School website details curriculum implementation, intent and impact
- Measures of success (for example: Phonics screening).
- How is the school closing the learning gap for the lowest 20% achievers
- Parent view comments

#### Behaviour and Attitudes:

- Attendance data
- Behaviour module is used at school to analyse patterns of behaviour
- Well Being survey (pupil and staff sound bites)
- Feedback from the parents

#### Governance:

- Governors' training and showing the impact it has
- Resources committee scrutinising of the budget
- Eco-school accreditation
- Regular SEF workshops

#### 2.2 MATHS CURRICULUM PRESENTATION:

A presentation to the GB on the Maths curriculum was led by Louise Foulkes, Maths lead, followed by questions and answers.

The Chair and Governors, on behalf of the GB, thanked Louise for her presentation.

It was highlighted that there is proposal to move the Forest school to the back of the school building and the front of school areas will be seeded up with wild flowers.

#### 2.3.2 Child and the Community Committee

Highlights from the committee include:

- SLT reinstating meetings with class representatives to build connections within the community
- Reading a deep dive exercise has taken place. All classrooms have phonetically coded reading books.
- BAME conference follow up; themes from the conference to be addressed. All published on Governor Hub.
- EDI action plan agreed following EDI audit.
- Review of pupil progress data and identifying lower attainment groups.
- Review of SEF.
- Robust remote learning in place.
- Access to afterschool clubs for disadvantaged children.
- Online safety review.

#### 2.3.3 Resources Committee

RH reported. Meeting took place on 09/05/2022.

#### Budget update

The **Year End** budget report was circulated to the GB ahead of the meeting and at year end 31.03.2022 there is a surplus of £23,104k. It was reported that the carry forward figure at the beginning of the financial year 2021-2022 was £162k.

The **Budget Forecast for 2022-2023** is showing an in year deficit of £141,553 and it is forecast the surplus at year end 2023 will be just under £5k

Increased pressure on the budget with progressive salary increments; teaching pay increase estimated at 2.75% in the budget plan; increased employer contributions estimated at 1.75%; increased utility bills Electricity increase by 59%; gas increase by 237% resulting in £80k increase in spend.

It was reported the Finance working party will reconvene to closely monitor the budget and find ways to generate income.

The GB AGREED the Year End report and Budget Plan 2022-2023.

### 2.3.4 Charities and Sponsorship Committee

EWe reported. No new contracts have been presented to the Committee for approval.

It was reported that a governor is conducting an independent review of the Martyn Gerrard contract.

#### 2.3.5 SEND Governor

CP and EWo reported. No meeting since last GB.

The first SEND Coffee morning took place on Thursday 21st March 2022

SEND link governors are linking with the Well Being team and reviewing feedback from parents.
