Dear Parents and Carers,

Happy New Year! We hope you all had a lovely break. The whole of the Year 4 team would like to take this opportunity to say a huge thank you again for our generous gifts. We really appreciate your support and kindness.

## Curriculum

**Geography** – Our Geography focus this term is titled ‘Coastal Processes.’ Children will be learning about coastal habitats using contrasting examples, including coasts of the Indian Ocean and then the West coast of Wales for in-depth study. We will also look at the coastal processes: erosion, transportation & deposition and the Jurassic coast including the significance of its rocks, fossils and landforms.

**History** – Our History focus this term will be on Roman Britain. We will be learning about the ancient Britons – a land of diversity, a land of migrants (e.g. Celts). Celtic language, Celtic culture, the rebellions of Caractacus and Boudicca, how Roman was Roman Britain? Who gained and who lost in Roman Britain? And the Collapse of Roman rule in Britain.

**Science** – Once we have finished our unit on Animals including Humans, we will be looking at *The Science of sound* – we will be looking at making sounds, vibrations, the ear, changes in pitch and volume.

**Music** - Our focus will be on icy timbres and textures in a range of contexts. We will identify the use of metre in 2 or 3 in a piece of recorded or live music, identify whether a song has a verse/chorus or call and response structure and recognise the combined effect of layers of sound by listening to their own arrangements and compositions.

**Maths** – We have started our new unit on multiplication and division. We will be looking at different strategies to solve questions involving each. Please look at the calculation policy on our website to see the methods we use.

**English** – We started this term with a short unit on instructional writing. We will be moving onto a narrative piece using the story, ‘Fox’, to plan and write our own stories using a range of grammatical techniques.

**PE** – will be taught by Mario Vitrano and Jason Bichri as well as class teachers. Our topics will be:

**Dance:** Rugby and the Haka, Cold Places

**Games:** Problem solving and inventing games

**Gymnastics:** Rotation

**Forest School:** This year, all Year 4 classes will take part in three Forest School sessions at Queen’s Wood. Occasionally, they may also travel to Highgate Wood. Each class will get 3 sessions each which will replace the two PE sessions normally timetabled for that week. This first half term will be red and orange classes, the second half term will be blue and purple. A letter has been sent home with further information about dates, timings and suitable clothing.

**PSHE** – we will be completing our learning on a families and relationships unit before starting our health and wellbeing topic. This unit will look at developing emotional maturity; learning that we experience a range of

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emotions and are responsible for these; appreciating the emotions of others; developing a growth mindset; identifying calming and relaxing activities; and developing independence in dental hygiene.

**Religion and World views education-** This term we will be finishing our work on Christianity. This unit of learning explores aspects of Christian festivals, celebrations, practices and communities and the beliefs to which they relate.

**Computing and Online safety** – Our topic for this term will be *Further Coding with Scratch*. We will be recalling the features of Scratch, what a variable is and how to make a variable and then to use this information to create a quiz. Our online safety lessons will look at explaining why lots of people sharing the same opinions or beliefs online do not make those opinions and beliefs true. We will also look at how technology can be designed to act like or impersonate living things.

**Spellings-** The children will continue to bring home spellings in their yellow books on Fridays to learn each week and then be tested the following week.

**Times tables** - This term, we are really encouraging the children to work hard on their times tables before the Multiplication Tables Check in June this year. A letter will be going home about this later in the year but for now, we ask you to support at home as much as possible. Each week, the children will be told which times table they need to learn for the following Monday. Spellings and Times tables are published on the Weekly Overview.

More detailed information about what we are teaching week-by-week can be found on the Weekly Overview that is published each Friday on Google Classroom.

### **Health and Well-being**

**Punctuality** – please ensure your child is in the classroom before 9am to ensure a smooth start to the school day. We realise mornings can be tricky for some families, but a punctual and calm start to a child's day makes such a difference to their well-being and ability to focus on their learning. The Senior Leadership Team will continue to monitor punctuality and attendance and you will be asked to attend a meeting if there is persistent lateness or low attendance. We are also monitoring children who are collected late from school as this poses a safeguarding threat. Please ensure your child is picked up at the correct time; it is distressing for children when there is nobody there to collect them and staff are very busy, making it challenging to look after any late pickups.

**Drinks and Snacks-** Children should only have water in their water bottles; they should not have flavoured water that contains sugar. Junior children should only have fruit or vegetables for a mid-morning snack. Please also ensure snacks do not contain nuts, or nut products, as we have several children with serious allergies.

The performance will last approximately 45 minutes. More information on this will come in the following months.

**Science Museum**- We are booked into to visit the Wonderlab and Wonder show at the Science Museum. We are splitting into two groups and attending on the 16<sup>th</sup> May (**Red** and **Purple** class) and the 6<sup>th</sup> June (**Orange** and **Blue** class). More information will be sent out closer to the time.
