

ParentHub



This term, we are launching our new school communication app for parents and carers, *ParentHub*.


The app is designed to keep you more up to date with school life and connected to your children's learning.

Please see the poster opposite on how to download and log onto the app using your smart phone. Once launched, you will be able to access information about the school, your child's year group, their class and their learning. Teachers will also be able to communicate directly with you via the app. Coleridge Families (our PTA) will also be using the app to disseminate information about their events.

If you do not have a smart phone or do not wish to download the app, all school communication will default to your email address.

Weekly Overviews

- The weekly overview will be sent out every week. It details
 the objectives that are being covered in English and maths, as
 well as any other subjects that are being taught that week. It
 will now be found on ParentHub.
- There will also be details of any dates for your diaries or reminders for parents.
- We will also send out the spelling rule and 6 spellings we are learning each week on ParentHub.





Reading



- From next week, every child will take part in a guided reading session once a week.
- In guided reading sessions, the class teacher reads with a small group of children of a similar ability. The children take turns to read aloud. This allows children to continue developing their decoding skills. It provides more opportunities to discuss the text and develop strong comprehension skills.
- Group guided reading sessions take place in a quiet area of the school and provide a positive, focused and enriching reading experience for children. They last for 20 –
 25mins.
- Children who did not meet the expected standard for reading at the end of Year 1
 (book band 5 or lower), will also take part in additional phonics and high-frequency
 word activities.
- Children need to be reading a **band 9 or 10** level book at the end of Year 2 to be at the expected standard.



Reading



- Children should bring their school reading book and reading diary into school when it is their reading day (We will let you know when this is and put the days up on the doors where you drop off and pick up your child). Up to **Band 6**, we send 2 books home. From **Band 7** onwards, we send 1 book home.
- Reading diaries: These are for you to sign and date when you have read with your child at home. Also included in these diaries are reading activities, reading challenges and the list of words that children should be able to read and spell by the end of Year 2.
- The class teacher will take a look at the diary each week but will not write a weekly comment.
- We will hear children read 1:1 in the penultimate week of every half term.
- In addition to their school reading book/s, the children will be able to choose a book of their choice from the school library once a week. They may need to read this book with a grown-up. Each class has a different library day:

2B: Wednesday 2O: Friday 2R: Thursday 2P: Wednesday



Reading at Home



We encourage as much reading to take place at home as possible. We would advise listening to your child read aloud for at least 10 minutes every day. It is also really useful to still read stories to your child, so that they can see the words as they listen to you, as well as develop a love of stories.








Spellings


- Each week, children will be given 6 spellings to learn that follow a particular spelling rule.
- Over the course of each week, we practise spelling this spelling rule and we
 do an informal spelling test at the end of the week where we include the
 words they have been learning at home.
- As with reading, children's spelling can be dramatically improved with regular practice at home.
- Every Tuesday we will send home a spelling activity sheet for your child to complete over the week to help them learn the spelling rule and their spellings.
- A letter will be sent home soon with some additional, simple games to help children learn to spell the 6 words.



How we teach... Handwriting




- Children will learn to write using a cursive script. Each week we learn 2-3
 different letters or groups of letters. These will be on the weekly overview.
- We are learning to use lead-in and lead-out strokes.
- We encourage children to start joining up in all written activities.
- They will not be expected to use a cursive style until they are ready to do so.
- Using a cursive script has a number of benefits.





Writing



- Children take part in regular writing activities.
- We teach both fiction and non-fiction writing throughout the year, as well as poetry.
- In each writing unit, we teach specific grammar and punctuation objectives.
- Please see the weekly overviews for detail on the genre of writing that we are covering and the grammar and punctuation objectives.



Maths




- At Coleridge we teach a maths mastery curriculum.
- The children are taught through whole class, highly interactive lessons enabling the children to master the concepts needed for the next step.
- We want to ensure children develop a deep understanding of the Maths, and have firm foundations in place as they move through the school.

Maths




- Lessons typically follow a 'ping-pong' structure in which there are various short activities for the children to complete as the teacher questions, explains and demonstrates the relevant concepts.
- Many of these activities will include the use of manipulatives.
- Children are taught as a whole class, and all children are given access to the same learning and tasks.
- Support is provided for any child who is finding the maths difficult. This support might be in the form of adult help, manipulatives, or an easier version of the same task.







Assessment

- We assess the children's understanding in every lesson using a range of different strategies questioning, discussions, observations, marking work etc.
- KS1 SATs these are now optional but we have decided to continue administering them. They will take place towards the end of the year and are run in a very lowkey way. The children are unlikely to realise they are even happening!
 We use the information we get from the SATS to help inform our own judgements, along with our own prior knowledge, observations, etc.
- At the end of the year you will be informed whether your child is working **towards**, within or above (greater depth) the national average in each subject.

Home learning

Each half term, **Home Learning** is posted on the school website.

Home Learning is **optional.** However, we strongly encourage your child to complete some of the activities to reinforce the message that learning isn't just confined to the classroom.

There are Home Learning documents for Maths, English & Wider Curriculum subjects.

There is a wide range of activities – some are creative whereas others practise skills learnt in class.

- Maths activities are posted on **MyMaths.** You should have login details already, but please speak to us if not.
- If you would like to read a <u>rationale</u> as to why we do Home Learning, this is on our school website in the Home Learning section.
- Although Home Learning is optional, <u>learning the weekly</u> <u>spellings is compulsory</u> as they are statutory and part of the National Curriculum.
