Make sure you think carefully about the different sub-headings of your report page before you start writing it.

Either find or draw a picture of an interesting setting. This could be something nice like the beach, ocean or park. You could also pick a scary setting like a cave or haunted house. Write a setting description about it. Remember to include lots of exciting and interesting **adjectives**. You could also use some similes.
