- Would you recommend the book?
- Who would enjoy this book?

You can then give it a star rating at the end!

OSteard

Pretend you are on holiday somewhere. It could be any country around the world, or even in space or under the sea!

Write a postcard from this place to a friend or family member.

Remember to:

- Write about what you have been doing there.
- Write about what it is like.
- Use informal language.

Year of reading!

This year, you will have read lots of different books! Try to think about your favourites and draw pictures of all these books. You might draw the pictures separately, or combine the characters from books to create 1 piece of artwork (you could have Halibut Jackson and Rocket on the moon with Bob!) At the end, you can look at how many different books you have read this year!

Reading prediction

Start reading a book you haven't ever read before (it could be the reading book you are given from school).

Only read the first few pages.

Then write down your prediction of what you think will happen in the story.

Read the rest of the book—were you correct?
