Using fine aluminium and copper wire, the children will develop their drawings into characterful sculptural portraits. THE GREAT WAVE
Skills: Drawing, collage
Learning about 'The Great Wave off Kanagawa" print by traditional Japanese woodblock artist Hokusai, the children will watch footage of real wave motion and study photographs of large-scale waves in various stages of formation and crashing. They will use Hokusai's sketchbooks as inspiration to make line drawings of waves that show motion. The children will formulate a colour palette from the waves they have observed before creating collage papers to that palette. Using their motion drawings to inform the shape, size and direction of their collage pieces, the children will create a dramatic collaged version of their own great wave, full of motion.
WILD AND FREE
Skills: Drawing, graphics (presenting information and typography), 3D (paper forming). This project begins with a collaborative and deliberately freeing and energetic drawing workshop where the children will develop their understanding of the use of line and expression. The children will make large scale drawings of wildflowers and hedgerow plants on reclaimed papers, before using artists inks to expressively wash and fill spaces, creating colourful, floral papers for bookmaking. The children learn how to fold zines and find out about the Bee-Lines initiative. The children then design a zine, inspired by artists' books and creative sketchbook use. They learn about fonts and creativity with type and develop their zine to effectively and expressively deliver their (Bee- Line) message through text and drawing.
