Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome back! We hope you all had a good break. We have another busy half-term to look forward to, and an exciting performance to prepare for!

Curriculum

History – This half-term, we will continue to learn about the Romans. In the previous half-term, we focused on the formation of the Republic, and this half-term we will learn about the growing empire. We will look at the Roman army, Julius Caesar, Augustus, Claudius, and Pompeii.

Geography – Children will be learning about populations this half-term. We will explore migration, the Haringey census, ethnicity, and ethnically diverse populations.

Science – Children will start a new topic on 'Animals, including Humans.' We will focus on food chains, teeth, and the digestive system.

English – To begin this half-term, we will be working on developing our own stories, using The Boy at the Back of the Class as inspiration. Children will craft a narrative story in which a character encounters a friend who needs cheering up and goes on an adventure. We will then move on to a poetry unit, exploring poetry from other cultures using the text Dancing in the Rain by John Lyons.

Maths – We'll continue with our work on addition and subtraction this half-term, focusing on teaching the formal written methods. After this, our focus will shift to length and perimeter. Towards the end of the term, we will start a unit on multiplication and division. You can check the weekly overview on ParentHub for a more thorough breakdown of the objectives covered each week.

Computing – This half-term, the children will continue to focus on Scratch. They will work on a project where they will create their own game, which will include multiple variables.

PSHE – We are also focusing on a Families and Relationships unit, which will extend into the Spring Term. In this unit, we will learn that families are varied and differences must be respected; understand physical and emotional boundaries in friendships; explore the roles of bully, victim, and bystander; examine how behavior affects others; discuss manners in different situations; and learn about bereavement.

Religion and Worldviews – This half-term, we will start our Religion and Worldviews topic on Christianity. The children will learn about the origins of Christianity and Christian celebrations.

Dance – The Year 4 teachers have been choreographing the dance the children will perform for the School Play. We will be dancing to *Danger Zone* by Kenny Loggins.
