## Curriculum

More information about the content of English and Maths lessons can be found in the **Weekly Overview**, which will be put on to Parent Hub every Friday afternoon. We encourage you to look at this so that you can talk to your child about what they are doing each week, and support their learning in these areas where possible.

**English** – This half term we will be using the text 'The song from somewhere else' by A.F Harold which is a wonderful story with loneliness, bullying and friendship as key themes. The children will be engaged in a range of different writing activities linked to this.

**Maths** – will continue to be taught in maths groups. We are all finishing off our units on the four operations before moving onto fractions. Content and order will vary a little according to the maths group your child is in so please do look at the weekly overview each week.

History – 'The African kingdoms of Ethiopia and Benin' Geography – 'Ethiopia' Science – 'The Science of Light'

Computing – 'Online Safety & The History of Computers'

Religions and world views - 'How People Express their Views'

D&T – 'Textiles'

# Play

Initially we will continue with maths and English as usual in the mornings and then the children will be working in their casts on different wider curriculum areas in the afternoons.

As we get very close to the play, this will change a bit as we will need to use some morning slots to rehearse. We will let you know about this as and when via the weekly overview on ParentHub.

A massive thank you to all the parents who are giving up lots of their time to help with the play; sourcing, measuring and adapting costumes, planning makeup and hair for the characters, and coaching children with their acting and singing. We couldn't do it without you!

#### PE

Children may have to miss their PE lesson if they are not wearing appropriate clothing. Please check when your child has PE during the run up to the play in particular as we are not following our usual timetable.
