

# Year 5 Home Learning

## Geography

This half term, we are learning all about **migration**. We will look at internal and international migration, as well as learn about refugees. We want you to look into your family history and discover any migration stories at home. It might be migrating from, or to another part of the UK, or migrating from different countries around the world.

Try to find answers to the following questions: Who migrated? What factors lead to that migration? When did it happen and what places were involved? Create a poster or fact file that you would be happy to share with the class.



## Computing

This half term we will be learning about music programming. We are using scratch to create soundtracks. Your task is to continue *tinkering* with [Scratch](#) at home and develop your own soundtrack for a particular scene in your favourite story.

Think about the atmosphere and mood you want to create. What sounds/instruments would best achieve this? Experiment with musical elements such as tempo, pitch, duration, texture and dynamics.



## History

This half term, we are learning about Viking Britain! Archaeologists have discovered various Viking artefacts around Britain, which historians have used to build our knowledge and understanding of this period in our history.

Research an artefact from Viking Britain and make a model of it. You could perhaps use cardboard, papier mâché or junk modelling.

It is up to you whether you choose to show the artefact in its original glory, or after it has been unearthed by archaeologists! How would centuries underground change its appearance?

These tiny lead objects were gaming pieces for playing board games. Archaeologists have found more than 300 of these at Torksey. This suggests that Viking men, women and children were playing games to pass the time.
