

What they need to know...

This half term, we will focus on Non-Chronological Reports. Objectives we will cover include:

Composition

- Can use a wider range of presentational devices in non-fiction writing, including headings, subheadings, diagrams, captions and bullet points
- Can make detailed observations about structure, vocabulary and grammatical features of example texts in order to help plan their own writing.
- Can structure their writing around a title, opening statement, clear and simple points, and a summary statement.
- Can use technical words, where appropriate.

Grammar and punctuation

- Can use conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions to express time and cause.
 - Examples of these include:

Time: First, Before, After, Next, Finally, Meanwhile

Cause and effect: Therefore, As a result, Consequently, This causes, This results in, When

- Can explain the following terms: determiners, pronouns, possessive plurals, adverbials.
- Can use expanded noun phrases for example: She walked through the dark, mysterious forest.

Take one text

In class, we will be building up to writing a non-chronological report about an animal. But there might be a famous person, historical figure, mythical beast, sport, place or hobby that you are passionate about! Your task is to choose something that you have an interest in and then research it using the local or school library, books you have at home, or the internet.

Use your research to write a non-chronological report about your chosen topic. You will need to include an eye-catching title, informative sub-headings and an introductory paragraph. Then think about what information you want to share in your main paragraphs; you want to include detailed, relevant, interesting information that you think others should know about your chosen topic. Remember, as you are writing a non-chronological report, you don't have to write things in the order in which they happened. You might even want to include some fun facts or diagrams with captions. Don't forget to finish your report with a summary paragraph!
