This home learning is a chance to practise and improve our writing skills. Have a go at doing at least one of these writing tasks.

Book review

Choose a book you really like and write a book review for it.

You can use these questions to help you:

- Is the book fiction or non-fiction?
- Where is the story set?
- What was your favourite part of the book?
- Who was your favourite character?
- Does the book remind you of any other books?
- Would you recommend the book?
- Who would enjoy this book?

You can then give it a star rating at the end!

Non-fiction report page

We wrote non-fiction report pages about Emperor Penguins and will be learning about red foxes. We want you to write your own report page about something that interests you. This could be about your favourite dinosaur or animal; a sport you like playing; or your favourite book, game or TV show.

Make sure you think carefully about the different sub-headings of your report page before you start writing it.

Draw a picture and write a description of the job you would like to do when you grow up. Make sure you punctuate every sentence correctly with a capital letter and full stop. Try and include these conjunctions:

- **because**
- **but**
- **so**
- **when**

Setting description

Either find or draw a picture of an interesting setting. This could be something nice like the beach, ocean or park. You could also pick a scary setting like a cave or haunted house. Write a setting description about it. Remember to include lots of exciting and interesting **adjectives**.

You could also use some **similes**.
