

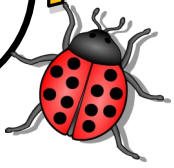
Year 4 Home Learning

History: 'Arabia and Early Islam' - we will learn about Arabia in 570 - 630 CE and the beginnings of Islam

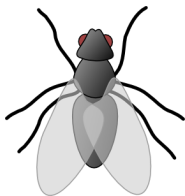
Science: After finishing 'Living Things & Their Habitats', we will learn about 'Electricity'.
